A Day in Life of a Coordinator

Being an Enrych coordinator is not without its challenges but I love my role and I get to meet some amazing people!

Sometimes, when I tell someone that I work for a charity they assume that I mean on a voluntary basis, but all of the Enrych coordinators are actually paid employees with specific roles and responsibilities.

I work part-time with Enrych at 25 hours a week and my main responsibilities include:

- Advertising and recruitment of volunteers
- Receiving referrals for new members
- Enrolling and supporting new members
- Supporting existing members
- Arranging pairings of members and volunteers
- Developing and maintaining the Enrych website
- Drawing up risk assessments
- Promoting our services externally and collaborating with similar organisations across the county
- Organising and delivering social events and Zoom sessions
- Gathering feedback and evaluations

There's a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes and as with all jobs, there's a reasonable amount of paperwork and administration required to make sure everything runs smoothly. However, I'm happy to say that there is no such thing as a 'typical' day at Enrych and every day we do our best to make sure that we are offering the best possible service to our members. So far this month, I've taken part in a wonderful trip to Southend-on-Sea, where a great time was had by all! I've visited new members and told them all about our services and the lovely people that they can expect to meet by joining our Zooms and social events. I've visited an existing member in the John Radcliffe, following a recent fall they had and shared stories about some of the trials and tribulations of time in hospital. I've spoken to new volunteers and scheduled introductions for them with our members. I've got to meet lots of you at thoroughly enjoyable pub lunches and I'm currently looking into other social activities that we can host, such as cinema visits and boat trips.
